A new book is now available, “Religious Liberty and the Fall of Babylon”:

Religious Liberty is a Biblical principle that man was created with a free will. Satanic forces have worked down the ages to persecute those who are faithful to God's commandments. God is calling people to come out of Babylon before it is too late, a symbol of the corrupt churches that break God's law, turn to civil power for support, and persecute God's commandment keeping people. “The first Sunday law was made in AD 321 by the Emperor Constantine. Over the centuries other laws followed, although many believers continued to observe the Sabbath and were still doing so in the fifth century. In AD 602, Pope Gregory identified Sabbath keepers with the antichrist, but despite this the Christians in Milan openly observed the Sabbath. In the twelfth century in order to convince people in England of Sunday sacredness it was claimed that a roll had fallen from heaven and been found on the altar of St Simeon in Golgotha. Another letter was said to have appeared on the altar of St Peter in Rome known as the “Epistle of Jesus”; this document was written into Irish law and threatens horrible calamities if Sunday is not honoured.” (a short extract from the book)

The principle of religious liberty is founded in the Biblical principle that we were created with a free will. One of the first examples of religious persecution was when Cain murdered Abel. Abel worshipped God according to God's instructions but Cain refused to offer a blood sacrifice and admit that he was a sinner in need of grace.

At the end of time, according to the prophecies of the book of Revelation, people will be persecuted according to whom them worship (see Revelation 13:15-17; 14:12). It is important to stand up for religious liberty.
