One of the beliefs of the Seventh-day Adventist Church is the gift of prophecy. An example of the prophetic gift at work is found in 1 Kings 22:1-9. Ahab king of Israel, and Jehoshaphat king of Judah agreed to go to war against the king of Syria to try to recapture some towns that belonged to Israel.

Jehoshaphat decided it would be best to inquire of a prophet of the Lord, and Ahab called his false prophets who all gave encouraging messages. Jehoshaphat was not satisfied and asked for a prophet of the LORD. Then Ahab admitted that there was still one true prophet named Micaiah, but he did not like him because he always prophesied bad things about him.

Micaiah was called and indicated that Ahab would die in battle. But Ahab ignored the message from the LORD and decided to go into battle in disguise to avoid being wounded, but a random arrow struck him in a chink in his armour and he died.

In the book of Revelation we are told that God's remnant people will keep God's Commandments and have the testimony of Jesus (Revelation 12:17). The dragon will make war against them. This testimony of Jesus is defined as the Spirit of Prophecy (Revelation 19:10).

Two of the identifying characteristics of God's end time people are the keeping of God's Commandments which would include the Sabbath, and the Spirit of Prophecy.

This gift of prophecy was manifested in the ministry of Ellen G. White as the Lord's messenger. These writings make clear that the Bible is the standard to test all truth.
